What is the time commitment?

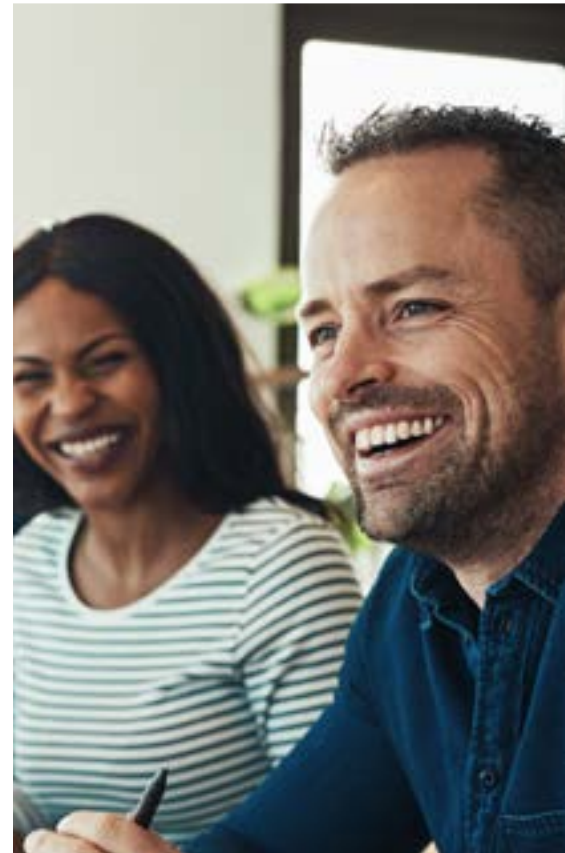
- **THE SOUTH CLINICAL ADVISORY PANEL** meets 11 times per year. Members spend about 3 hours per month on Clinical Advisory Panel responsibilities: 1 hour prep time and 2 hours meeting time.
- **THE NORTH CLINICAL ADVISORY PANEL** meets 6 times per year. Members spend about 3 hours every other month on Clinical Advisory Panel responsibilities: 1 hour prep time and 2 hours meeting time.

- We promote high-quality language services for all Medicaid members
- We identify opportunities to reduce health inequities and improve care using data
 - \$3.8MM invested in 2023 for social determinants of health
 - \$21.9MM invested in 2023 for community benefit initiatives
